An open access texbook



Online introductory lectures for each texbook chapter



Online collection of primary sources in the original language and English translations



A best-practice guide for the international classroom



Through the increasing globalisation of the higher education sector, the demand for English-language courses has risen at universities all over Europe. However, history departments wanting to internationalise their curricula often depend on teaching material that does not reflect the range and multi-perspectivity of European history. TEH21 aims to change this.

TEH21 will result in innovative teaching material based on textual, visual and audiovisual sources produced by international author teams.

The project runs over three years (2019-2022) and is funded by the European Commission under the Erasmus+ Key Action 2 (Cooperation for innovation and the exchange of good practices).
